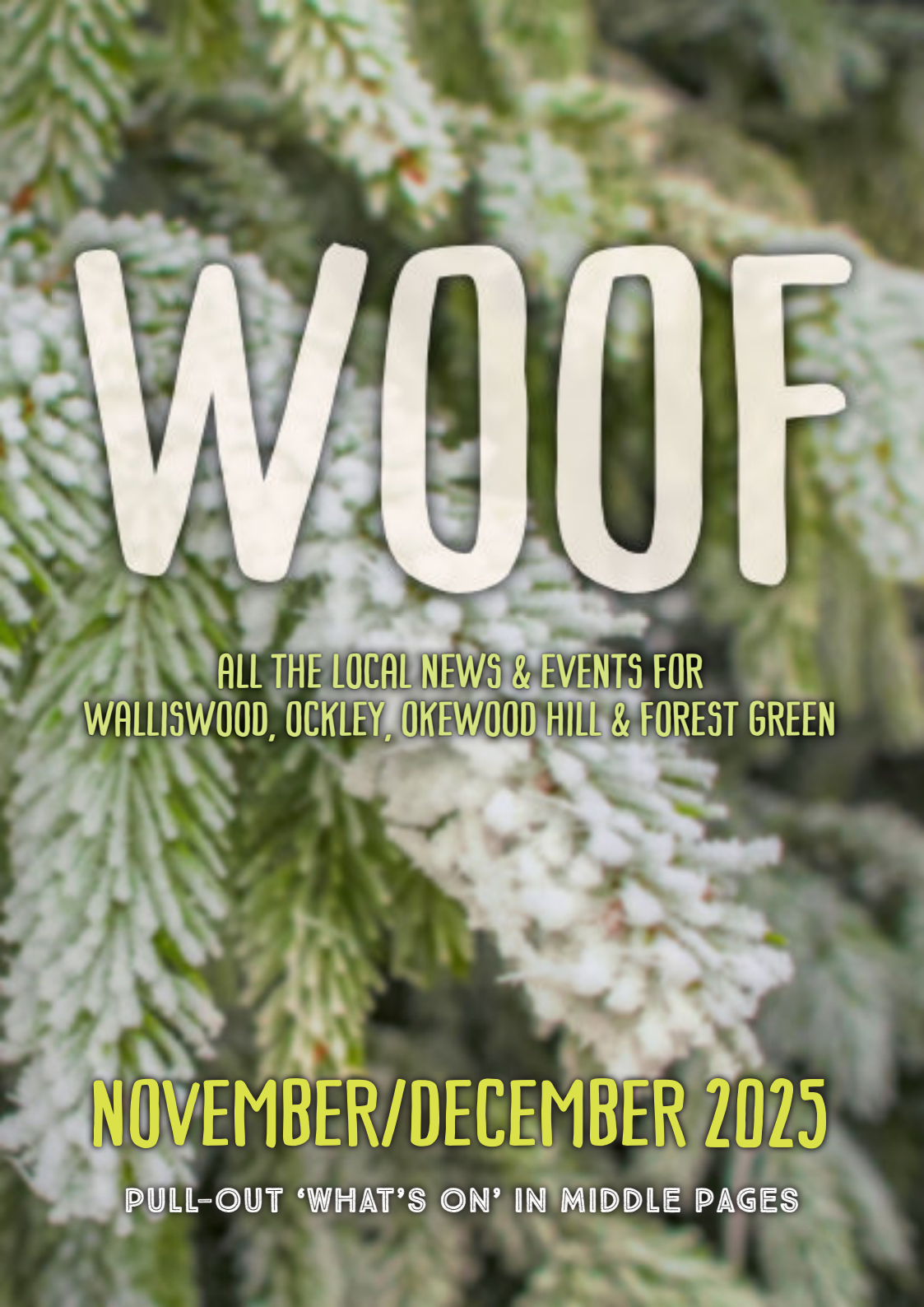

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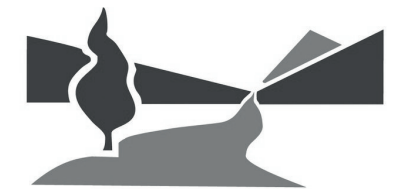

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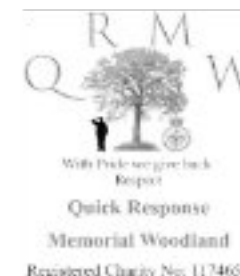

Good food, friendly faces and blazing Autumn sunshine – all conspired to make the Village Greens Farm Shop annual Ockley Food Fair another fabulous event. And it would seem to have been a great turnout with lots of support for the producers and the shop.

With well organised and free parking, a small entrance fee going to charity and the hugely talented Anoushka Assisi singing live, this was a lovely afternoon out with grandkids and dogs. There was a tempting array of different produce; rich honey, home-cooked pies, irresistible pastries, glorious cheeses, decadent chocolate, refreshing gin, exotic and unusual mushrooms, chilli sauces, chutneys and jams; along with a BBQ cooking highest quality burgers and sausages served with fresh tomato and watercress, wood-fired pizzas cooked fresh on site, plus delicious (and enormous!) ice creams, to name just some of the 20+ producers that meant we were spoilt for choice.

THE GARDEN IN NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

As you read this, the weather has likely shifted from the hot, dry spells of earlier in the year to the colder, windier, and wetter days of late autumn. At the time of writing, we're just coming out of an 'Indian Summer'. Thanks to recent rain and misty, dew-laden mornings, many gardens have enjoyed a final flourish of blooms - roses, dahlias, gaura, cosmos, heleniums, asters, cyclamen, sedum, and Japanese anemones have all put on a last show.

By November, though, most gardens are ready to be 'put to bed' for winter. This means moving tender plants into shelter, such as a greenhouse or cold frame. If you leave dahlias in the ground, cover them with a generous layer of mulch. However, if your soil is heavy clay and temperatures drop below freezing for several days, dahlia tubers can rot. In that case, it's safer to dig them up and store them in pots or trays filled with compost or sand, somewhere dry and cool.

Beds and borders will benefit from a thick layer of garden compost, which will nourish and protect them through the harshest months. Ideally, you'll have already divided and transplanted perennials, but there's still a little time before the real cold sets in. Most spring-flowering bulbs should be in the ground by now, but you can still plant daffodils and crocuses until the end of November. Tulips, in fact, prefer to be planted in November, as the colder soil helps prevent rot. If you have heavy clay soil, add some grit when planting bulbs to improve drainage and reduce the risk of rot.

Keep lawns clear of fallen leaves - using a lawn mower set high is an efficient way to collect them. The leaves you gather will make excellent mulch once they've decomposed. You can speed up the process by mowing over the leaves first, then storing them in black plastic sacks with holes or in a simple bin made from posts and chicken wire.

Now is also the time to prune tall roses to prevent wind damage to their roots, and to tie in climbing plants, cutting them back by about a third. Climbing roses can be pruned in winter, but wait until February to prune most other roses. Winter is also the right time to prune apple and pear trees, as long as they're not cordons.

Raise pots off the ground to prevent waterlogging, and wrap them in fleece or bubble wrap if a hard frost is forecast - especially important for potted citrus trees left outdoors.

In the vegetable patch, harvest any remaining root crops such as leeks, parsnips, carrots, sprouts, and winter cabbage. If you planted seed potatoes in sacks in August, you might even have fresh potatoes for Christmas dinner!

As food becomes scarce for birds, keep feeders topped up with nuts, seeds, and other treats. Birds quickly become regular visitors and if they find empty feeders they waste precious energy. Providing food and fresh water is vital for their survival through winter.

Late November is also a great time to gather materials for a Christmas wreath. Holly, laurel, bay, rosemary, pittosporum, and euonymus make a lovely base, and a few berries or rosehips add a festive touch. If you're not sure where to start, look out for wreath-making classes at Oakwood Village Hall in the last couple of weeks in November.

NEWS FROM THE BELFRY

New Learners

We are now 'twinned' with Newdigate in that the Ockley band all ring there every week on Tuesdays for their practice nights, weddings and Sunday services. This has been the case informally for some years but became a necessity due to a shortage of ringers at Newdigate and the retirement of their tower captain.

The practice of clustering with neighbouring towers is always beneficial because it allows a greater spread of experience and learners can progress more easily at whatever level they are when spare ringers are available to stand behind and offer advice. It also makes the evening more enjoyable for everybody as practice nights are a social gathering as much as they are about bell ringing.

A number of towers in the area have been silent for some time, such as Burstow, Horley and Charlwood due to a decline in numbers such that the bands eventually become unviable. Service ringing can then only continue with the help of outside ringers called on as needed. The Surrey Association has successfully targeted these towers amongst others with a support group to recruit new ringers. They help with recruitment ideas and supply training for the new learners. A sudden influx of so many potential ringers creates a huge demand for trainers and so we have helped by visiting their towers as well as giving one to one training in our home towers.

Being recruited in a short space of time their new ringers have formed numerous friendships, with Whatsapp groups pinging back and forth. Although they come from all walks of life, they have a new hobby in common and plenty of experiences to share. It is lovely to see so much enthusiasm from the newbies and most learners are the same: there is a rush of adrenaline from trying to control something so much heavier than you and this can only be learnt in the tower, so the amount of rope time available is crucial in the early stages. Once handling is established there is a lifelong learning experience for those who choose to enter the world of method ringing.

Bellringing is an enjoyable pastime, open to everyone and probably not what you expect. Come along and be surprised! Anyone interested in finding out more is welcome to come along and have a go, under supervision, or just to watch. Practice nights are at St Peter's Newdigate on Tuesdays and St Margaret's Ockley on Wednesday evenings from 7.45pm to 9pm.

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BORDERLANDS

Probing the Sussex Perimeter (stage 43)

The following verses are taken from a new epic poem titled 'BORDERLANDS – Probing the Sussex Perimeter'. Commencing in Stage 1 at Worthing Pier, direction of travel is clockwise around both halves of the county and ending some 300 miles later back at the start point.

Five years in the writing, 'BORDERLANDS' includes every city, town, village and hamlet within two miles of both sides of the picturesque Sussex border. From southernmost Selsey Bill to its farthest north point on the boundary with Surrey at noisy Gatwick Airport, from the intriguing emptiness of Thorney Island in the west to the other-worldly desert of Dungeness near the Kentish border to the east, everything is covered here. Also of major importance are the many verses concerning the stunning Sussex countryside and the changing seasons as the journey progresses

The near 40,000 word work is divided into 112 stages comprising 9 x 4 line verses each. I present here Stage 43 for the good folk of splendid Ockley.

Quiet Rowhook occupies a spot far off from public gaze
Where local life revolves around the Chequers Inn most days
The line of Roman Stane Street passes through its restaurant wall
Yet no time warped Centurion has ever come to call

There's oil beneath the Surrey Hills just waiting to be fracked
Yet prospectors have come and gone the odds against them stacked
Shooed away by people power who rise up in their droves
The use of filthy fossil fuel and ground shift to oppose

The Border path near Ruckman's Farm takes up the Stane Street line
For a brief 300 yards we're back 2,000 years in time
Treading where bold chariot wheels bounced over Sussex clay
To and from Londinium throughout their grand heyday

While crossing Roman Stane Street – today's A29
We looked both ways then breezed across holding the county line
No chariots career today along this ancient straight
No peacock strut Centurion to make us stand and wait

Ockley's fine smock mill collapsed in 1944

Henry Cole later became the founder of the Victoria & Albert Museum, while he strongly supported the development of the British Postal System.

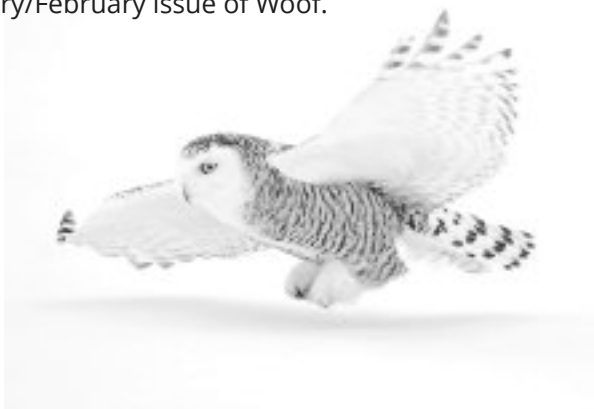

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NEW CURATE FOR ST JOHN'S OKEWOOD

Sarah Murphy, who with her husband, Tom, moved to Walliswood in 2021, has recently been ordained at Guildford Cathedral through the CofE's 'Caleb Stream' (for more mature individuals!). The following is an excerpt from a very potted biography that was written for the diocesan website.



My family of origin was not churchgoing, but I had a praying grandmother who ran Sunday school in her Welsh church. As a child, I attended a Catholic prep school where Raphael's Madonna and Child watched over us. Weekly recitations of the Lord's Prayer and the Magnificat moved me so deeply that I began attending Evensong with a school friend. Around age ten, I asked to be confirmed, but was told I was too young. That rejection left me disheartened, and I stepped away from church until I was twenty-eight.

At that time, while working in banking, I met some Christians who encouraged me to attend an Alpha course, which led to confirmation. However, my faith was more intellectual than personal. It took another ten years before I realised that all I had previously valued – success, status, achievement – was ultimately meaningless. Only a life submitted to God made sense. I threw myself into church life, attending courses and events, eager to grow and make up for lost time.

Fifteen years later, while juggling work and single parenthood, I sensed God calling me out of the workplace to deepen my discipleship. I completed a year-long training with Ellet Ministries in Prayer Ministry and Discipleship, joined their team, and began studying theology. During this time, I met and married a wonderful Christian man. Together, we felt called to support our local church and, by God's providence, found a tiny spirit-filled church in the woods near our new home.




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PARISH ARCHIVES

The Parish Archives collected by Briony Thomas hold copies of the parish magazines from 1884. Initially, the Ockley magazine was combined with Capel and Newdigate with separate sections for each parish. Okewood was added from 1890! The January 1885 issue states that this is the first of a new version of the magazine, to include notes of local interest, history of the churches and the parishes. The magazines included a national section called Dawn of Day which had previously been circulated without the local notes. That issue records that Mr J.W. Firth, a pupil teacher at Ockley, had graduated from St Mark's College, Chelsea, presumably the son of Mr Firth to whom a presentation was made of a testimonial and a cheque of £80 on retiring from teaching at Ockley School after 41 years recorded in the December 1889 issue!

Then there is a gap from 1914 to 1942, after which there is a fairly complete run up to date, entitled initially Ockley, then Ockley and Oakwoodhill, after the benefices were merged in 1992.

There are also some Oakwoodhill magazines, 1918 and 1971 to 1983.

WOOF (Walliswood, Ockley, Okewood Hill and Forest Green) replaced the parish magazine when the Ockley benefice merged with Capel and Okewood with Ewhurst in 2019.

I try to find interesting extracts from old magazines. The December 1899 issue for Ockley contains a report that the committee of the Capel, Ockley and Newdigate Horticultural Society were entertained to dinner by the President W.A. Calvert at his home, Bromells. The presentation to Mr Firth recorded above, meanwhile a Temperance Society concert in Capel raised £3.

The December 1946 issue records the confirmation of David Ansell, Kenneth Pearce and Oliver Coleman among others. It records Southdown sheep grazing on the Green like old times and bemoans the lack of fresh mutton during the war, being replaced by frozen mutton from abroad and recommends a book by H. J. Massingham, Where Man Belongs, which bemoans the fading away of handicrafts to be replaced by machine-made goods and of the mixed family farm. Nostalgia for past times is not a new phenomenon.

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UPDATE FROM WIENERBERGER EWHURST BRICK AND TILEWORKS COMMUNITY LIAISON COMMITTEE

The recent community liaison committee (CLC) held on 11th September 2025 was attended by representatives from Surrey County Council, Abinger Parish Council, Ewhurst & Ellens Green Parish Council, Okewood Hill Residents Association and company representatives from Wienerberger.

In between CLC meetings, Wienerberger hosted a community engagement event to discuss proposals for 13 dwellings (9x self-build and 4x affordable homes) to be built on the Old Ewhurst Brickworks site (postcode GU6 7SW), which is classified as 'previously developed land' and 4.2 acres in size. The event took place on 21st August, between 2:00pm and 4:00pm, at Ewhurst Village Hall and had a steady flow of residents visiting. The main concerns raised were about access to public infrastructure (e.g. bus routes and footpaths) and the available partners to build the 4 units classified as affordable homes. The planning application has now been submitted and can be viewed on the Waverley Borough Council planning register, reference WA/2025/01930. The consultation is open for comments until 07/11/2025.

As mentioned previously, in order to reduce its carbon emissions, the Brickworks is seeking planning permission to install a solar farm in its field behind the factory. The proposed scheme is a 1.6 MW system comprising 4,000 solar panels which could supply around a quarter of the factory's electricity demand per year, and up to 80% of the electricity demand in the summer when generating at full capacity. The planning application has been submitted to Surrey County Council and can be viewed at: https://planning.surreycc.gov.uk/Planning/Display/SCC_Ref_2024-0180#

The most recent stack emissions test from the Brickworks confirmed that emissions to air are comfortably below the permitted levels, and the emissions scrubber is operating well.

The extremely popular annual National Trust Heritage Open Day was held on 20th September. Once again there was a good turn out and visitors received a factory tour with the opportunity to have a go at making handmade roof tiles. If you missed it this time there should be opportunity to join us in September 2026.

Ewhurst brick and tileworks Community Liaison Committee (CLC) is a gathering of residents, councillors, council regulators and staff at Wienerberger. Members come together three times per year to discuss the interaction of the Ewhurst brick and tileworks operations with the local community. The discussions span a variety of issues and can include



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everything from supporting community groups and local events, to environmental monitoring and HGV traffic management in and around the factory. Members can recommend topics for the agenda according to their interests.

In between the CLC meetings, members are encouraged to share points of interest with their neighbours and the broader community through whichever channels are accessible to them. These conversations help residents understand more about Wienerberger's operations in their local area and in turn the feedback provided to Wienerberger helps the company to positively contribute to the local community and swiftly address any concerns if they arise.

Airspace above your home

to the east and west of Gatwick Airport (including north and south) with or without a new runway.

CAGNE, the umbrella aviation community and environment group for Sussex, Surrey and Kent, hosted online events to help residents understand the airspace above where they live. Also to understand what airspace change may mean for them. The recording links can be found at www.cagne.org.

CAGNE now having served a letter of intent to serve a judicial review on the Secretary of State for Transport after her approval- so the legal process has begun to stop this new runway due to the impact it will have on local environments as well as the planet with little in the way of benefits.

Aviation is a complex subject full of lines on maps hiding locations, heights that make no sense, Leq, Lmax and decibels, and acronyms of procedures.

The aim of airspace above your home events, one to the west and one to the east, was to enable residents to have a basic understanding of what they are looking at as when faced with airspace change (potentially second quarter of 2026) they will be able to comprehend better what it will mean for them with or without a new runway.

The new aviation government appointed body UKADS (UK Airspace Design Services) proceeds with the desires of Gatwick for maximum growth to the south assisted by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) which will control the CAP1616 seven stage consultation process and the conclusion on airspace change.

The northern airspace changes will have to wait a while as Heathrow's airspace comes first in order of priority for capacity change.

Departure Noise Preferential Routes (NPR) are more or less ignored now as concentrated flight paths were introduced on all Gatwick departure routes in 2014. Ground based beacons are no more.

Arriving aircraft currently fly within a swathe of area. This is to be replaced by 3 or 4 concentrated flight paths to the final approach (instrument landing system - ILS - called as such as the beacon from the end of the runway guides in landing planes) with planes joining at 8nm, 10nm, 10nm, 12nm and straight in at 14nm daytime (nm = nautical miles).

What will modernisation of airspace bring? The above concentration on arrivals (using Performance Based Navigation), continuous climb operations (departures climbing higher quicker CCO), potential for new flight paths over new areas, holding stacks will go to free up airspace for more routes, time-based separation of arrivals (to reduce the time between arriving aircraft) and an increase in capacity for Gatwick.

What will the new runway mean? It will not necessarily fly north and will not have night movements from 11.30pm till 6.30am. It aims to add 101,000 flights a year from two departing runways with only the main runway accepting arrivals. We expect more go-arounds due to lack of ground operations and complexity of the traffic light holding system and the crossing of the new runway from the main runway to reach the terminals.

No increase in night flights with the summer schedule 11,200 flights and winter 3,250 plus dispensations given by the government (more flights). However, aviation continues to lobby for quotas to be used which will enable increases in night flights.

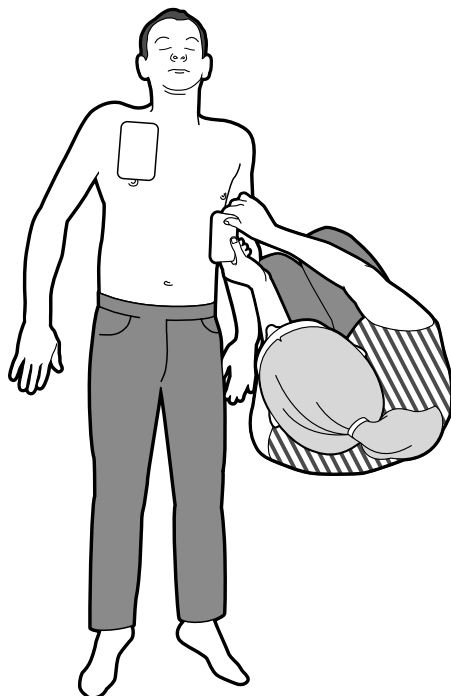
HOW TO USE A DEFIBRILLATOR
